Students should know and be able to demonstrate mastery in the following skills by the end of Third Grade:

- Organize and develop artistic ideas and work.
- Explore materials to create artwork.
- Demonstrate safe and proper procedures.
- Identify and classify through drawing.
- Refine and complete artistic work.
- Use art vocabulary to describe choices in art-making.
- Know the differences between materials, techniques, and processes.
- Describe how different materials, techniques, and processes cause different responses.
- Use different media, techniques, and processes to communicate ideas, experiences, and stories.
- Use art materials and tools in a safe and responsible manner.
- Explore and understand prospective content for works of art.
- Select and use subject matter, symbols, and ideas to communicate meaning.
- Use illustrations and details in a story to describe its characters, setting, or events.
- Generate and conceptualize artistic ideas and work.
- Elaborate on imaginative ideas.
- Apply knowledge to develop personal ideas in artwork.
- Create personal artwork
- Demonstrate understanding proficient use of materials.
- Construct everyday life representations.
- Refine and complete artistic work.
- Elaborate visually by adding detail during art-making that enhances meaning.
- Use illustrations and details in a story to describe its characters, setting, or events.
